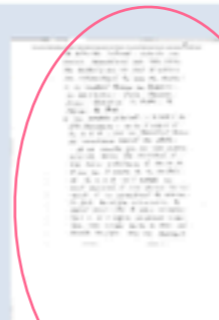

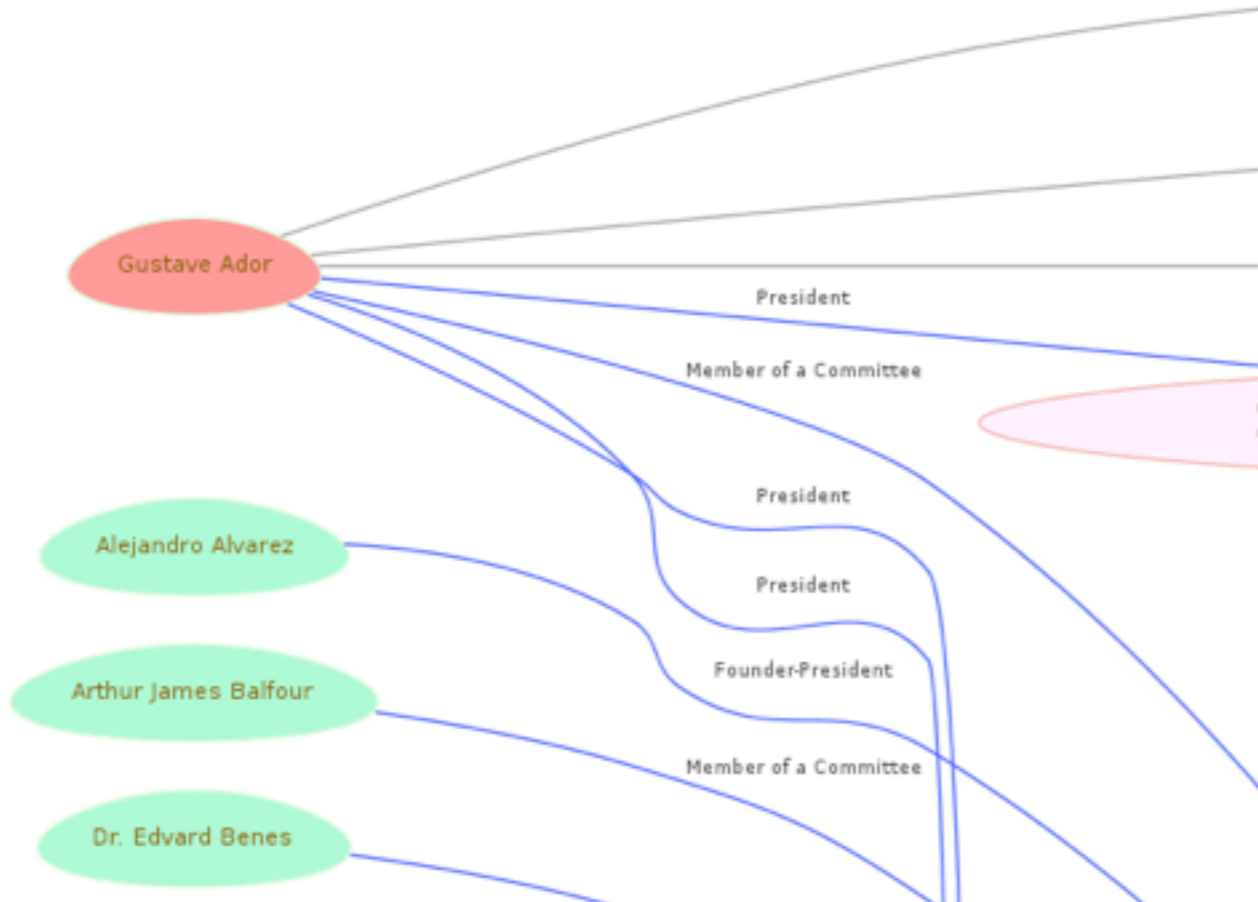

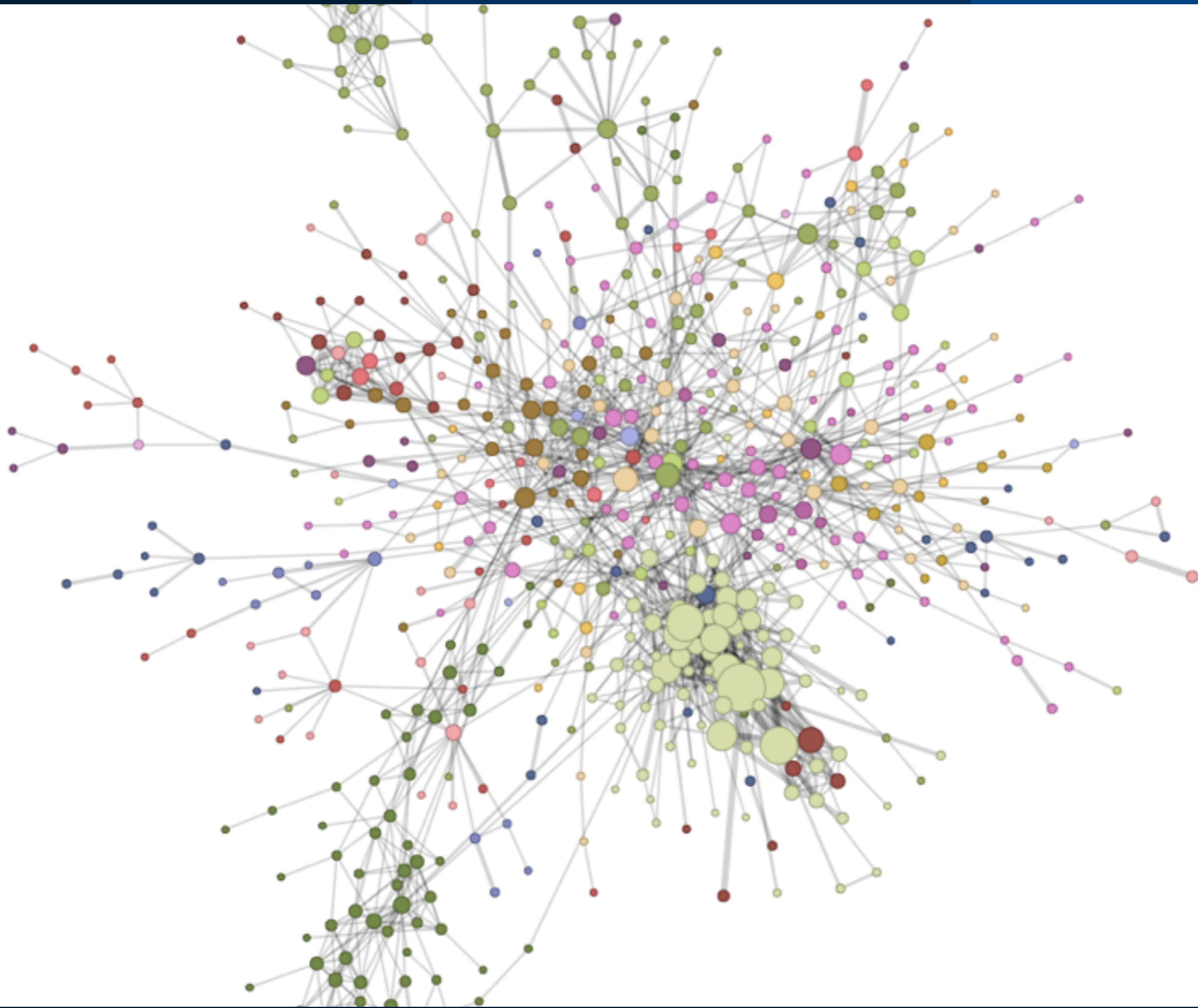

Social Media at Dodis: Small Team, Big Impact

It is time for another spotlight on some of Switzerland's social media champions in universities and research. This time I had the pleasure of taking a closer look at **Dodis**, a research project that maintains a database of Swiss diplomatic documents and publishes books with a relevant selection of these documents. Researchers Christiane Sibille and Ursina Bentele, as well as Dodis director Sacha Zala, kindly answered all my questions about their social media presence.

Those who visit the **Dodis Facebook page** for the first time might wonder why they have an abundance of pictures showing a black bag with a Dodis logo in front of different backgrounds. At least that's what I was wondering when I browsed through their timeline a while back.

Dodis, short for "Diplomatic Documents of Switzerland," is a research project consisting of historians from different Swiss universities. The project aims to select, digitize, and publish key

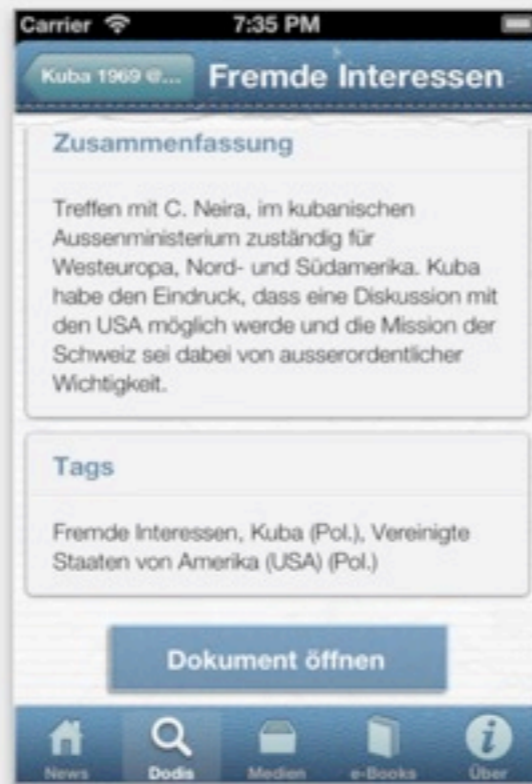

Why Declassify?

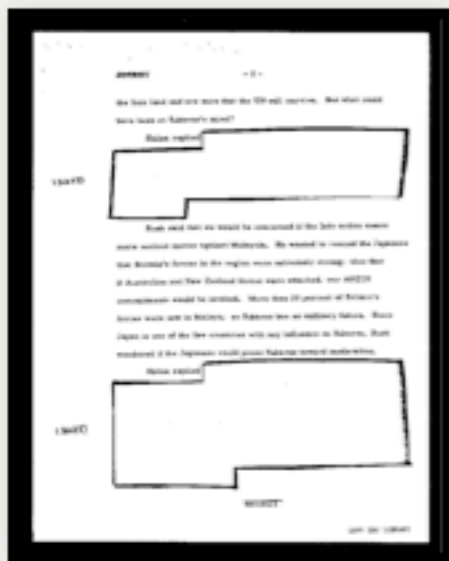
The **government** is keeping more and more secrets, and the volume of documents has grown to an unmanageable size. The **National Archives** estimates that just **one intelligence agency** produces a **petabyte (1,000,000 gigabytes)** of classified information **every 18 months**, and that it would take **two million people** working for **a year to** review these records and release them to the public. Reviewing the tens of petabytes produced annually would occupy **every single state and federal employee full-time.**

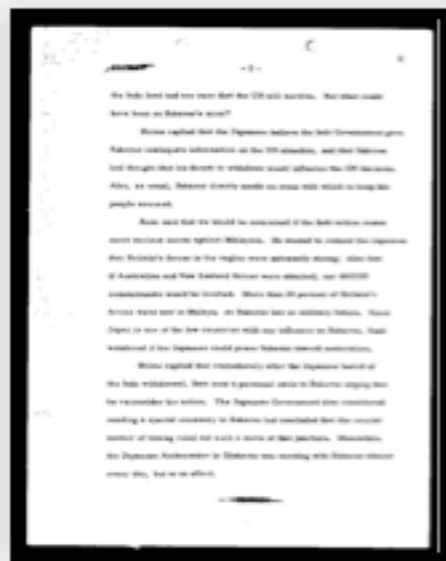

Indonesia's withdrawal from the UN. Indonesia could have prevented Malaysia's membership on the security Council by merely objecting and didn't. We don't expect other nations to follow -2- the Indo lead and are sure that the UN will survive. But what could have been on Sukarno's mind? Shiina replied **that the Japanese believe the Indo government gave Sukarno inadequate information on the UN situation, and that Sukarno had thought that his threat to withdraw would influence the UN decision. Also, as usual, Sukarno clearly needs an issue with which to keep his people aroused.** Rusk said that we would be concerned if the Indo action meant more serious moves against Malaysia. He wanted to remind the Japanese that Britain's forces in the region were extremely strong; also that if Australian and New Zealand forces were attacked, our ANZUS commitments would be invoked.
